Regulations

1. The total credits required for graduation are 31 credits (comprising 13 required credits, 12 elective credits, and 6 thesis credits).

2. Credits per semester: First-year students may register for 6–16 credits in their first semester; all other semesters allow 3–16 credits.

3. Students must either complete the academic ethics course offered by the Taiwan Academic Ethics Education Resources Center and obtain a certificate of completion, or attend at least 6 hours of academic ethics-related workshops and obtain a certificate of participation. When applying for the master's thesis oral examination, students must submit one of the aforementioned certificates; only upon review and approval may the application for the oral examination proceed.

4. With the approval of the department chair, master's students may, for research purposes, take courses offered by other graduate institutes or departments. A maximum of two courses may be taken, and the credits earned may be counted toward elective credits.

5. Within the prescribed period of study, students who have completed the required courses and credits stipulated by the Graduate Institute and achieved passing grades, and who also meet one of the following requirements, may apply for the degree examination within the prescribed deadline. Students may graduate only after passing the degree examination.

(1) During the period of study, students must meet one of the following academic publication requirements:

- (a.) Publish in an academic journal with a review system and an ISBN.
- (b.) Present a paper orally at a conference with a review system.
- (c.) Publish in a proceedings volume with a review system and an ISBN.

(2) Obtain at least one international professional certificate in the field of information management. The certificate type shall be based on the "Professional Certificate Point Conversion Table of the Department of Information Management, Ling Tung University of Science and Technology, " and the certificate must be worth 3 points or more.

(3) Have related publications or works, excluding the master's thesis, reviewed and approved by the Graduate Institute's Academic Committee.

6. Prerequisite Courses: (1) Statistics, (2) Data Structures, and (3) Management.

(1) Students who have completed one of the above courses during their undergraduate studies, with three or more credits and a passing grade, are not required to take remedial courses. Otherwise, they must take one of these courses from the undergraduate program during the first year of their master's studies; however, the credits shall not be counted toward graduation credits.

(2) Students who have taken courses during their undergraduate studies that differ in name from the prerequisite courses specified by the Graduate Institute but are the same or similar in content, and who have received passing grades, may submit relevant supporting documents, such as a course completion certificate issued by the original institution including the course

syllabus. Upon review and approval by the Graduate Institute, they may be exempted from taking the remedial course.
